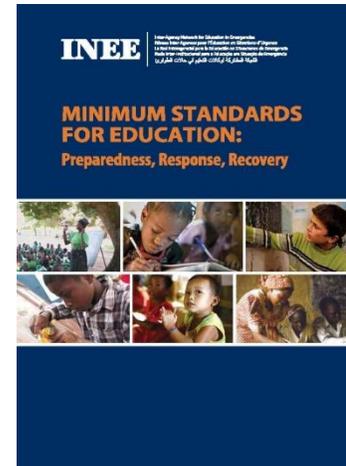

The INEE [e-learning module](#) uses the example of the Darfur refugee crisis to demonstrate how the INEE Minimum Standards can be used as a framework for designing quality education programs in conflict-induced situations. This module helps learners understand the Standards and how they can be used to improve the quality of education assistance. It may be particularly helpful for people who cannot attend an INEE training in person.
